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





A Look at Various Communities (youngest to oldest)




Utah County Communities vs. State vs. U.S.




Women are Waiting Longer to Have Children



















KEY FACTS

• 39% of Utah County households make \$75,000 or more

• 21% of households make less than \$30,000

• 30.1% of householders headed by a Hispanic person make \$75,000 or more; this compares favorably to the state's percentage of 27.1 and the national number of 28.5

• The average family income for Hispanic families is \$51,238 – higher than the state's \$49,196 and the nation's \$49,539

• Utah's family income defies national trends: as number of children increase, Utah's family income increases







KEY FACTS

• 42% of all children living with a single mother in Utah County are in poverty

• 9% of children living with two married parents are in poverty

• 51% of children younger than 5 living with a single mother are in poverty

• Utah County defies state and national norms: of all families in poverty, 69.9% are families with children in Utah County, compared to 77.8% statewide and 76.5% nationally

• More than half the people living in poverty in Provo are college students



College Enrollment and Poverty





Ratio of median home value to median family income was 3.4 in 2016





We are Buying Homes that We Can't Afford

Only 17.1% of homes with a mortgage in Utah County are valued at less than 2x the family's income—compared to 35.1% of homes nationally.

29.5% of homes with a mortgage in Utah County are valued at 4x or more than the family's income—compared to 26.5% nation.





Students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 who consumed 5 or more alcoholic drinks in a row in past 2 weeks





- 14.3% of adults have tried e- cigarettes; 3.6% are current users
- · 3.6% of adults are chronic alcohol users
- 7.6% have engaged in binge drinking in the past 30 days






Utah County has Only 1 Domestic Violence Shelter Bed for Every 24,194 Residents

KEY FACTS

• In 2014, there were 856 district court cases of protective orders or stalking injunctions in Utah County

• Statewide, there were 3,945 cases of violence against boyfriends or girlfriends tried in Utah courts

• 2,324 cases of violence against spouses were tried

• 56% of all supported allegations of elder abuse were in the form of financial exploitation

• Nearly 57% of elder abuse victims are female



UTAH BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL HEALTH

While depression is increasing only slightly among adults, it is increasing significantly among youth.


KEY FACTS

- Utah's suicide rate is 6th worse in the nation, at 21 suicides per 100,000 population. Alaska, New Mexico, Wyoming, Montana, and Idaho have worse rates.
- In 2015, there were 93 deaths due to self-inflicted injury in Utah County
- 17.8 percent of adults in Utah County say they had 7 or more days of poor mental health in the past 30 days
- Mental health as a community issue was ranked 4.5 on a scale of 5 among Utah County adults, compared to 3.9 in 2014




Disability by Age




Disability by Hispanic Ethnicity



KEY FACTS

- · About 1 in every 60 eight-year- olds in Utah have Autism Spectrum Disorder
- The most prevalent disability among all Utah County residents is cognitive difficulty, with 4.1% of the population experiencing this
- 50.3% of those age 75 or older are living with a disability
- About 0.6% of children under age 5 have a disability
- 7.7% of males and 8.1% of females have disabilities in Utah County
